You are the Messiah sent by God. It is necessary for the Son of Man to suffer much.

One day when Jesus was praying alone in the presence of his disciples he put this question to them, 'Who do the crowds say I am?' And they answered,

'John the Baptist; others Elijah; and others say one of the ancient prophets come back to life.' 'But you,' he said, 'who do you say I am?' It was Peter who spoke up. 'The Christ of God' he said. But he gave them strict orders not to tell anyone anything about this.


'The Son of Man' he said, 'is destined to suffer grievously, to be rejected by the elders and chief priests and scribes and to be put to death, and to be raised up on the third day.'

Then to all he said, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross every day and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake, that man will save it.'

The Gospel of the Lord.

Reflection by Greg Sunter

In today's gospel, Jesus asks the disciples the question that has echoed through the intervening generations and continues to demand our attention today: 'Who do you say that I am?' With both hope and trepidation, Peter answers, 'The Messiah of God'. The gospel episode reveals that Jesus was aware that the people were speculating about him and it would have been obvious that the disciples themselves were debating amongst themselves the



significance of this man they were following. The expectation about the coming of the Messiah had been rife for decades leading up to this time. Under the occupation by the Romans, the Messiah expectation was at an all time high. Every Jew of the time was longing for the Messiah to rise up from their midst and rescue the people.

When Peter says that the disciples believe Jesus to be the Messiah it is as much a statement of hope as of conviction. What an amazing break for the disciples to discover that they are the followers of the one person the entire Jewish people are hoping for. The reflected glory for them would be magnificent! As Peter utters his answer, you can almost see the disciples edging forward in anticipation of all that would come their way as disciples of the Messiah.

But Jesus immediately shatters their dreams of glory by spelling out to them the reality of what it means for him to be the Messiah and also what it means for them to be his disciples. It is not the pathway of triumph and glory that lies ahead but the pathway of sacrifice, service and suffering. Peter is completely right when he names Jesus as Messiah but completely wrong in what he thinks that means.

I'm off to WYD in Rio!

In October last year I was encouraged by Miss Bond and Mrs Hutchinson to apply for a position in a group of young teachers from the Ballarat Diocese to attend World Youth Day in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. This was being offered by the Catholic Education Office to teachers who have had less than five years teaching experience and under the age of thirty. After completing an in depth application I was lucky enough to be chosen as one of eight teachers to attend this event. Seven months later and here I am giving you an update on how my organising is going. So far I have met up with three other teachers who I will be travelling with me as well as our group organiser, Stacey Atkins, and Fr Andrew Hayes. There have been many emails sent to organise accommodation and to let me know of some of the practicalities of the trip. I am now in the process of organising injections and visas.

I will be flying out of Australia on Tuesday 16th July and arriving in Santiago, Chile. My group will be staying here for five days where we will be working with the Columbian priests and the missions that they have set up there. Specific details on this are still unknown at the moment but I will receive more information soon. I then fly to Rio de Janerio where I will be staying in a warehouse at the end of a pier for seven days. During this time I will be a part of the World Youth Day celebrations. I am sure that I will have many wonderful experiences during this event that I will be sure to share when I return. After World Youth Day I then spend three days in another part of Brazil on a retreat which will allow me to reflect on the experiences of the event. I then return to Australia and land in Melbourne on Sunday 4th August.

- There are 50 pilgrims on Mission Chile
- There are 157 pilgrims going as part of the Victorian WYD pilgrimage
- There are about 1200 from Australia

I would like to thank the members of the Parents and Friends and all the students who purchased a hot dog for the money that was raised to help me pay for this trip. An important aspect of attending World Youth Day is the fundraising beforehand. I will keep you up to date with more details as I get them.
