Gospel Jn1:6-8.19-28

A reading from the holy Gospel according

There stands among you, unknown to you, the one who is coming after me.

A man came, sent by God. His name was John. He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light.

This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked, 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not,' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied:

a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.'

Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you - unknown to you - the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.

The Gospel of the Lord.

Reflection by Greg Sunter

This week's gospel should sound very familiar. It is the gospel of John version of the passage used in last week's liturgy, which



came from the gospel of Mark. Again it recalls the ministry of John the Baptist but it is given the particular slant of the gospel of John. Aside from the greater focus on the conversational interaction, it presents John as a 'witness'. This is perhaps more typical of the John gospel emphasis on personal encounter with Jesus. Rather than acting as something of a herald, as in last week's account, here John the Baptist is witnessing 'to speak for the light'. He makes a very clear distinction between himself and the Christ, his mission is simply to point towards the light; the Christ.

Our common understanding of the word 'witness' tends to be related to legal situations: providing a witness statement or acting as a witness to a fact in court. The use of witness in this gospel carries a different connotation: to provide witness through action and lifestyle that draws others to wonder about and perhaps come to accept the motivating belief. It is this understanding of witness that all Christians are called to provide. We are called to witness to our beliefs in the way that we live our lives, engage with others and hold to certain truths. Of course, there are some Christians who believe that their witness needs to be more obvious and more clearly stated. They feel that providing witness, or testimony, to their faith through spoken proclamation has a greater potential to change lives. Whether we choose to witness through our words or through our actions it is essential that both words and actions have integrity; that there is no clash between what we proclaim and the way we live.



Dear Father Patrick

I am sorry I cannot be present to join with you as you farewell Sr Margaret Carmody and the presence of Good Samaritan life and mission in Hamilton.

Our Congregational history with the Hamilton community dates back to 1924 when our sisters arrived to continue the administration and teaching at the local Primary and Secondary schools following the withdrawal of the Loreto Sisters.

We, Good Samaritans, have lived in and served the people of Hamilton continuously through a variety of ministries for these past ninety years. Our ministry in Hamilton was primarily in education - through St Michael's High School, St Mary's Primary School, St Mary's College, Monivae College and Maryknoll College. After withdrawing our sisters from the ministry of education, our Good Samaritan presence remained connected with the schools as our sisters worked in various support ministries and then in more recent times, we moved into parish ministry.

As Sr Margaret departs our Congregation ends 90 years of life at St Mary's Parish. Over these past 90 years - 162 Good Samaritan appointments to ministry have been made. By our records, some sisters obviously enjoyed their time as they returned for a second term! The sisters who lived and worked among the people of Hamilton have experienced love, care and support from the various priests and parishioners and we are grateful and richer as a Congregation for this experience and this involvement.

Another interesting fact I noticed when reading our history was that, it was the hope of Mother Marcella back in 1924 that our congregation may benefit from vocations by moving the sisters to Hamilton. History has proved her to be correct with over 100 women joining our community from the western districts!

As you would appreciate making decisions to withdraw from a Parish is not one that comes easy to me or to my Council but we make these decisions in a spirit of hope and confidence. We hope that as a Congregation our presence has made a difference and we are confident that we can leave this area knowing that our legacy will continue to grow.

As you gather to give thanks for our sisters, and especially Sr Margaret, may you do so in the knowledge that the Hamilton Parish and its hospitable and generous parishioners have a special place in the heart and history of our Congregation.

Again, I am sorry I will not be able to attend the farewell. Sr Veronica Hoey will attend and represent me.

With blessings as we approach this Advent season.
